

Section 8 Wait List Opening





The Section 8 wait list is only available online, and fees are never charged to apply. Applicants must keep their receipt upon completion. Income eligibility is not assessed and no documentation is needed to apply for the wait list.

The wait list is based on a lottery system so that everyone who applies for the wait list has an equal chance of being put on the wait list no matter if they are the first or last to apply. 3,000 families will be selected to be on the 2019 wait list via a randomly assigned lottery number. Applying for the wait list does not guarantee someone to be placed on the wait list. Once lottery numbers are assigned, applicants will be notified and served in order of lottery number.

What is Section 8?

In the Housing Choice Voucher Program, commonly known as "Section 8", Homes for Good provides rental assistance to low-income families accessing a home through the private rental market. To do this, Homes for Good forms a connection between families and landlords. Through the Housing Choice Voucher Program, families maintain secure, quality housing in neighborhoods of their choice. Under Section 8, Homes for Good pays a fixed amount toward the rent, based on the household income and the applicable payment standard set by the agency. Participants are responsible for finding a suitable unit that: (1) Has a gross rent amount that falls within the determined rent limits. (2) Can pass a Housing Quality Standards (HQS) inspection.
